Here are some ways you can support your child's phonics learning at home.

## Phonic Lessons

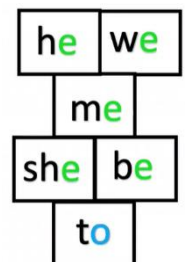
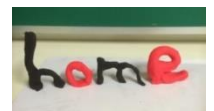
## Read to and with your child.

If you only have the smallest amount of time...read 😊

Daily reading is essential to support your child's phonic learning. Don't be afraid to re-read books as this will help your child build up their vocabulary, word-reading skills and comprehension.

## Get creative

- Use paints, crayons, pastels, gel pens to write new sounds or words.
- Build the words or sounds - Use playdough, plasticine or salt dough to create models of the words.
- Get outside - Draw a hopscotch on the ground or write the sounds on stones and practise building words.
- Use a painting App to practise spelling words using different colours.
- Flashcards - These can be downloaded free from the Monster phonics website. Use them in games like pairs or snap or even hide them around the house to create a scavenger hunt.



## Monster Phonics StoryTime

Listen to some great stories about the different monsters from Monster Phonics. Read the words along with the story and then have a go at the comprehension questions at the end.

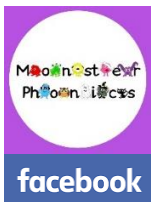
Try the new Monster phonics Apps. These are available on all tablets and android phones currently (coming soon to iPhone).
